- We will have a free dinner at the December Yankee swap meeting which will feature the same popular appetizer menu as last year.
- Ray reminds us to please bring **a gift that YOU would like to receive** to the Thursday, December 9 Yankee swap meeting, approximate value of \$25.00. No booze or gift certificates, please.

In the new year the food option for Nashua Country Club meetings will change! The meal will be a banquet entree selected by the country club chef, usually chicken, less often beef or pork, seldom, if ever, fish. Go to your app store and put in "DMSS". Take the first option that comes up (not DMSS lite or DMSS plus), just DMSS. You must have a good internet connection for this, as the access code DMSS will email to you is only good for a few minutes. **Set up your account and establish a password and user name and record these**. For those who do this ahead of the next meeting, we can have Ray Menard take a minute to get us on the pond cameras. I just installed the app on my phone and set up an account. I am now ready!
- People fishing the pond report that the newly stocked fish are tough to catch, but there is one theory that the fish will turn on more as the temperature of the water hits the lower temperature level to which our fish were accustomed, so keep fishing, while the ice is out!
- Upcoming Fishing Shows. The board has decided to buy a booth at the 19<sup>th</sup> Annual Fly Fish NH show. The new venue this year is at the Doubletree Convention Center, 2 Somerset Parkway, Nashua, NH, and will take place Saturday, February 26 from 9 AM - 4 PM. Let a member of the board know if you'd like to take a shift manning, or womanning our booth. The Marlboro Fly Fishing show is January 21, 22, and 23.
- We will once again be offering fly tying lessons in January, February, and March, as soon as we get room confirmation. Bob Cox has generously offered to be our instructor.

Our business portion of the meeting concluded, the diners enjoyed their meals, topped off with Molly Mink's excellent pumpkin cookies.

The night's speaker, Lou Zambello, gave a great presentation on some less pressured primo fishing spots in New England. He gave us the benefit of his many years of experience here in our home waters.
